Gi oss i dag vårt daglige brød.


Forlat oss vår skyld, som vi og forlater våre skyldnere.

Celebrating The Life Of
Joel A. Lund
September 8, 1935 - March 18, 2021





Joel Arlan Lund was born September 8, 1935 to Arne O. Lund (born in Dokka, Norway) and Leonora “Dalen” Lund in Belle Fourche, South Dakota. He attended grades 1-5 in a one room schoolhouse in Harding County, South Dakota. His family’s homestead was a sheep ranch, part of the rural community known as “Gustave, South Dakota”.

In September 1947 Joel moved with his parents to Milan to attend sixth grade taught by Ruth Hakes. He joined the Milan Boy Scouts and went to Valley Forge Jamboree and a canoe trip. He was confirmed at Kviteseid Lutheran Church in Milan.

After graduation from Milan High School, Joel attended and graduated from St. Olaf College in 1958. He enlisted in the United States Army and served from 1959-1960.

Joel worked for Northwestern Bank in Appleton for 39 years, retiring in 2000. An active member of Kviteseid Lutheran Church in Milan, he served two terms as trustee, two terms on the endowment board, financial secretary for many years, and an usher since 1950 including several years as head usher. As evidenced by receiving the Wm. Thompson Jr. Citizen of the Year Award in 2003, Joel was active in community activities including Milan American Legion for 57 years, having served as secretary; Milan Lion’s Club member of 32 years serving as secretary-treasurer; and a Milan Community Education Advisory Council member. Joining in 1951, Joel made many friends in the Sons of Norway in Benson. He joined the Appleton Golf Club in 1960 and was handicap chairman for several years. Joel loved to support youth activities. He followed Lac qui Parle Valley sports teams faithfully. He donned his cowboy hat to attend high school rodeos.

Joel enjoyed traveling, including eight trips to Norway. His first trip was in 1967, accompanied by his parents and met relatives on both the Lund and Dalen sides. He traveled on tour groups in 1989, 1992, 2000, 2001, 2005, and 2010. In May of 2014, a tour group consisting of 37 descendants of 11 of the 112 signers of Norway’s Constitution in 1814, celebrated the 200th anniversary of the signing. Joel’s great, great, great grandfather from Telemark was Talleiv Huvestad. Joel’s grandfather Lars Dalen was Talliev’s great grandson. Joel’s other travels included Israel, Egypt, Greece, Iceland, Alaska and many other parts of the United States.

Joel is survived by many cousins, extended relatives and friends. He was preceded in death by his parents.

Joel died Thursday, March 18, 2021 at Appleton Area Health Services in Appleton Minnesota at the age of 85. Joel was a kind, generous man with a servant’s heart.
