Good friends, good times, a loved one's touch.

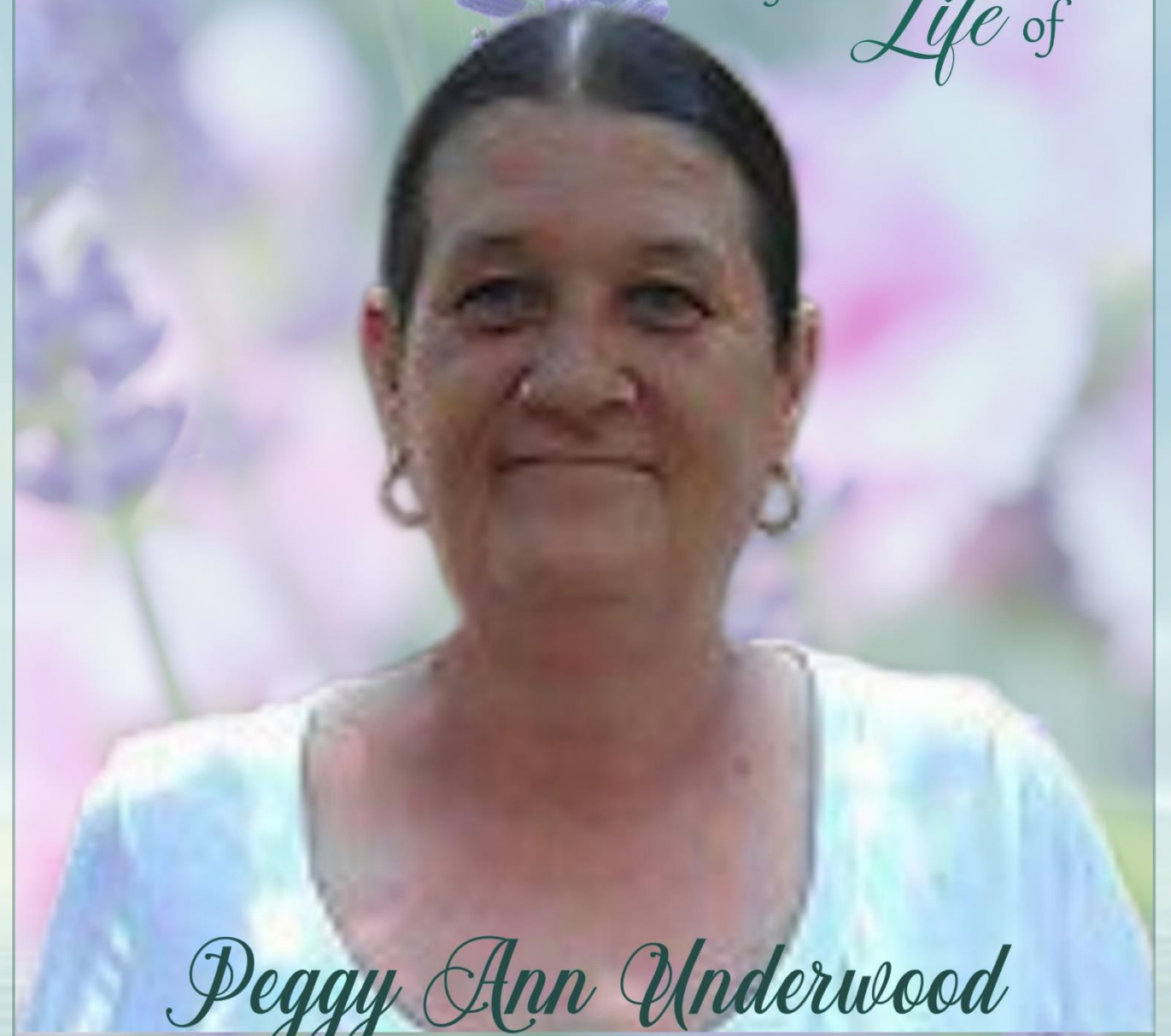

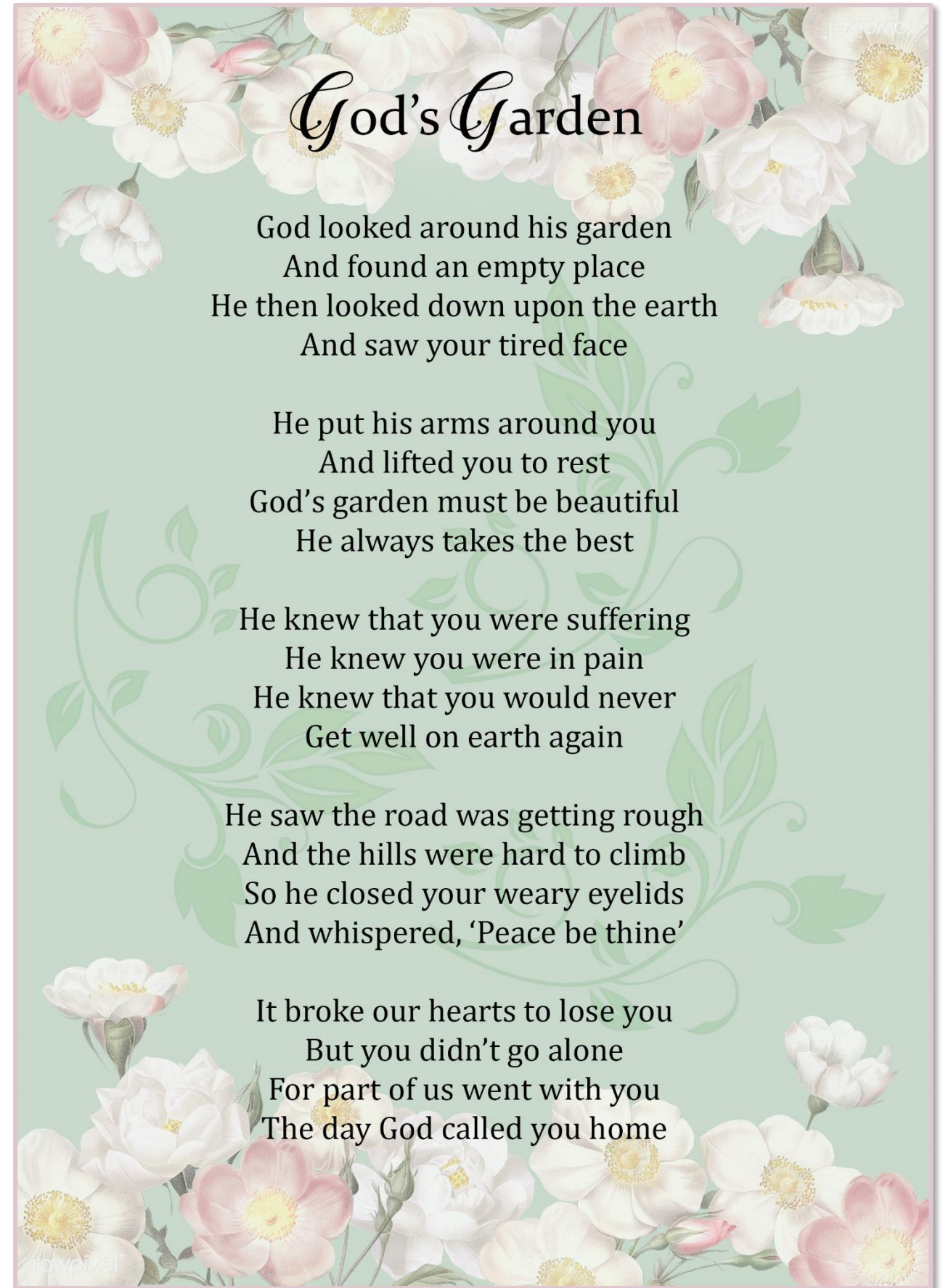
Peggy Ann Underwood was born May 26, 1959 in Columbus, Ohio to Dallas and Nancy Underwood. Peggy was one of six children.
