




The Lord's Prayer

Andrew Wayne Dyer; many called him Andy, or even Drew, was born in Springfield, Missouri on January 12th, 1962. He continued to be raised in Springfield, where he was given a Catholic education and later graduated from Central High School in the Class of 1980.

Mid-Morning of March 20, 2023, at age 61, he was accompanied by family as he peacefully left this life in his Clever home. He was diagnosed with Stage 4 Brain Cancer in late January of 2022. While this Cancer was unbeatable, Andy still managed to pass with remarkable victories. His gracious wife, Lisa often noted, "He never complained, not once."
