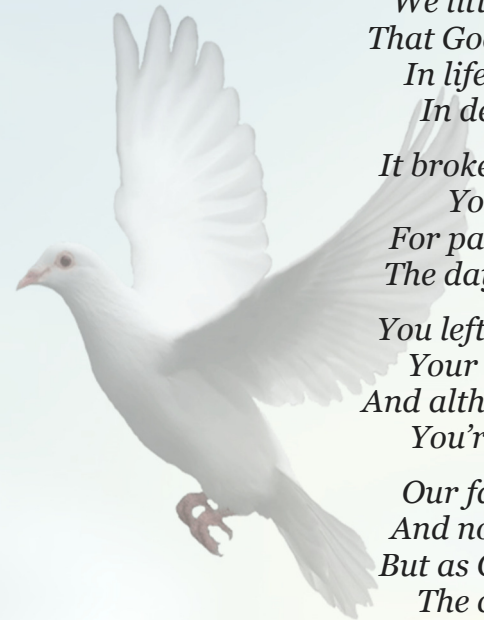
The Broken Chain
