"We love and miss you Grandma and wish that you were here."*

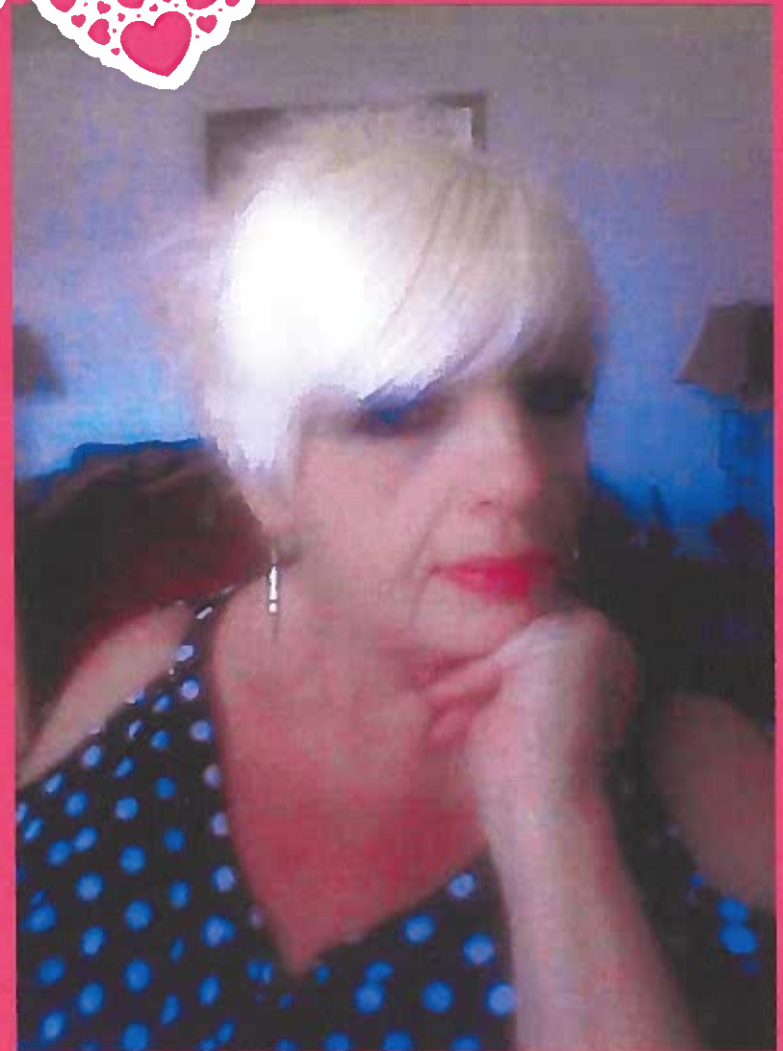
