Obituary

Phyllis Ann Wright was born to Fred Eugene and Grace Leticia Lowery in Columbus, Ohio on April 17, 1933. They lived on the Hilltop, a quiet neighborhood on the Columbus West Side. She attended public schools in Columbus, graduating from West High School as an honor student.

Phyllis married George (Bill) Addison, who was serving in the military as a First Lieutenant. They were blessed with daughter Jacqueline, born at Fort Sill, Oklahoma and son Howard, born in Stuttgart, Germany.

Phyllis met Lucien (Bus) Wright following his acceptance as Choir Master at St. Phillip Episcopal Church. As a current member of the choir, she and Bus married and were blessed with son Lucien II, and daughter Lauren.

Phyllis' professional career started at the Ohio State University as a surgical technician. Following Lucien II's and Lauren's births, she was employed by the CBS affiliate, WBNS-TV. While there she was promoted to head the department responsible for all the information needed on the sequences of broadcasting events from sign on to sign off after just two years, holding one of the highest positions of any woman in local television in Ohio at the time. This experience in the data processing area qualified her for the position at the IBM Corporation where she became an analyst and manager. She was a former member of Lambda Zeta Chi Sorority, Jack and Jill and the Northeasterners. Her career took her to Hillsborough, North Carolina, where she made her second home.

Phyllis loved playing the piano and singing. She was in several choirs, a musical while in Germany, and loved singing along with her favorite recording artist while watching concerts. She loved traveling and spending time with her sister Shirley. She loved completing crossword puzzles. She spent several years participating in the customized construction of her home. She was an avid OSU Marching Band fan. Marching her own Script Ohio in her living room before every football game.

In addition to her parents, Phyllis was preceded in death by her brother, Fred Jr., nicknamed Scanny (Ruth); sister, Marcia (Rudy) Cross; brother, Michael and son Howard (Herline).
