Ricco taught young Theara to squat, hold a bat that was taller than her and hit a baseball into the parking lot. The girls, Lydia, Melita and Abigail, recall marching and chanting, "Ric-co, Ric-co, Ric-co"; he would join in, chanting and laughing.

Most importantly, Ricco knew Jesus. He had been a member of Greater Twelfth Missionary Baptist Church and St John AME Church, attending Sunday School and the Men's Bible Study. He has left us, but we are sure Jesus took him home! Ricco is loved and will be missed by us all.
