The greatly desired and beloved firstborn son of Alonzo and Pastor E. L'Tanya Lemon, D'Shawn Emmanuel Lemon, was born on April 15, 1970. D'Shawn was raised in a multicultural structured home, his father from a proud Jamaican heritage and his mother of African American descent. These two cultures blended to emphasize the bonds of family, faith, and community.

From birth D'Shawn was a very special child and was considered a "beautiful baby," he even won a baby photo contest. Along with his good looks, D'Shawn was known for his charming, humble, and loving personality, that was embraced by all who met him. His presence lit up every room that he entered—and it seemed impossible not to be drawn to him. He had a beautiful smile and infectious laugh that would win over the hardest of hearts. He was always full of laughter and love.

D'Shawn was a product of the Columbus Public Schools system and graduated from Mifflin High School and Southeast Career Center. While at Mifflin, D'Shawn was a varsity wrestler and football player with a promising athletic future, until an unfortunate injury redirected his path. This would later produce several honors and recognitions for D'Shawn including a first-place gold medal in the NAACP ACT-SO competition; an honor that gained him national recognition. His parents encouraged him to further his education, and he attended Grambling University in Grambling, LA.

Along with his formal education D'Shawn was known as a hard worker who was able to fix and repair almost anything, especially electronic devices. D'Shawn gained much of his skills learning from his father who was a master carpenter. In addition, D'Shawn was extensively trained in electrical engineering and a certified electrician. D'Shawn embraced his entrepreneurial spirit and was a self-employed contractor working on diverse endeavors ranging from home repair to major construction projects.
