In death we do the same

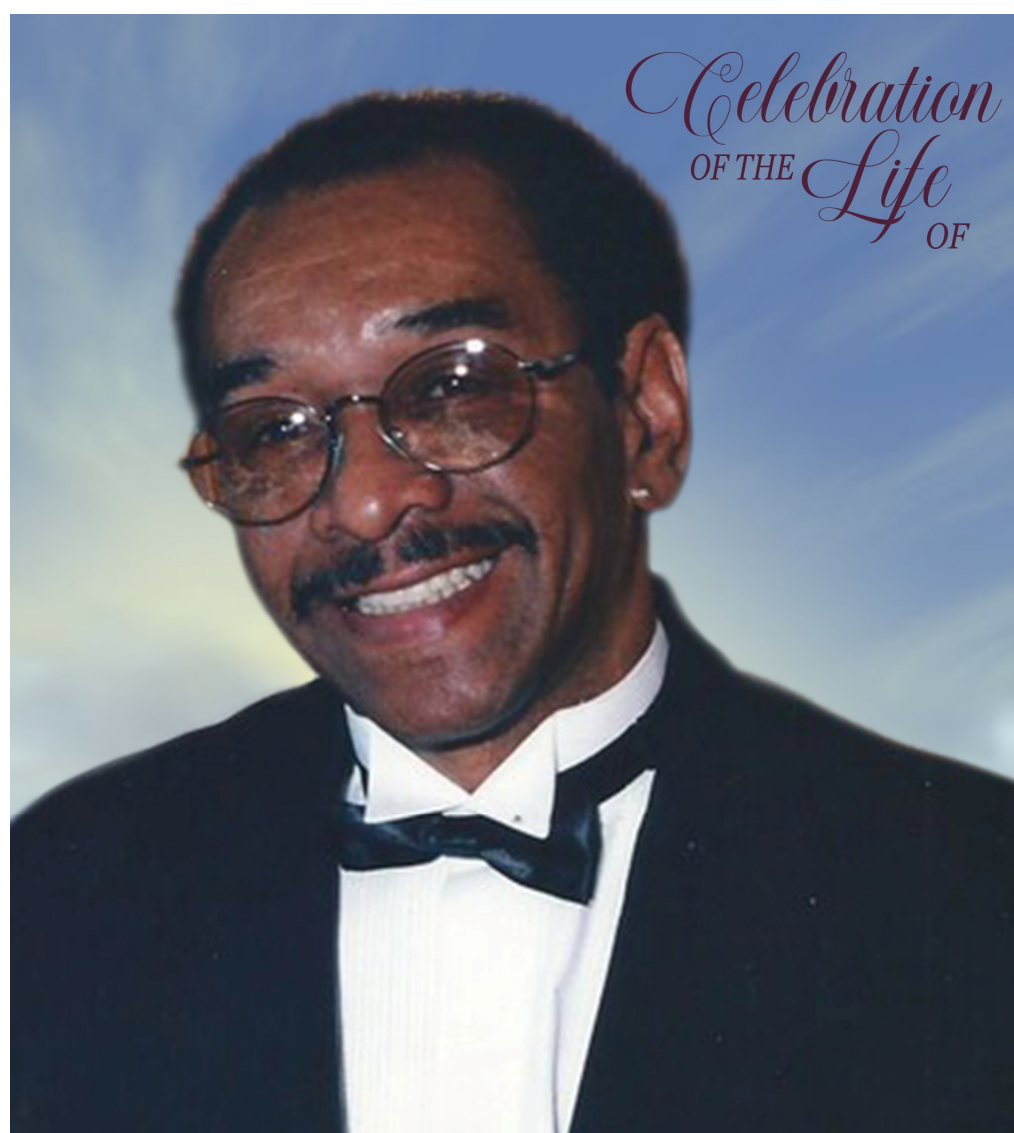
It broke our hearts to lose you
