Remember me with smiles not tears, For all the joy through the years. Recall the closeness that was ours, A love as "sweet" as fragrant flowers.


Don't dwell on thoughts that cause you pain, We'll see each other once again. I am at peace...try to believe, It was my time...I had to leave.
