When you saw only one set of footprints,

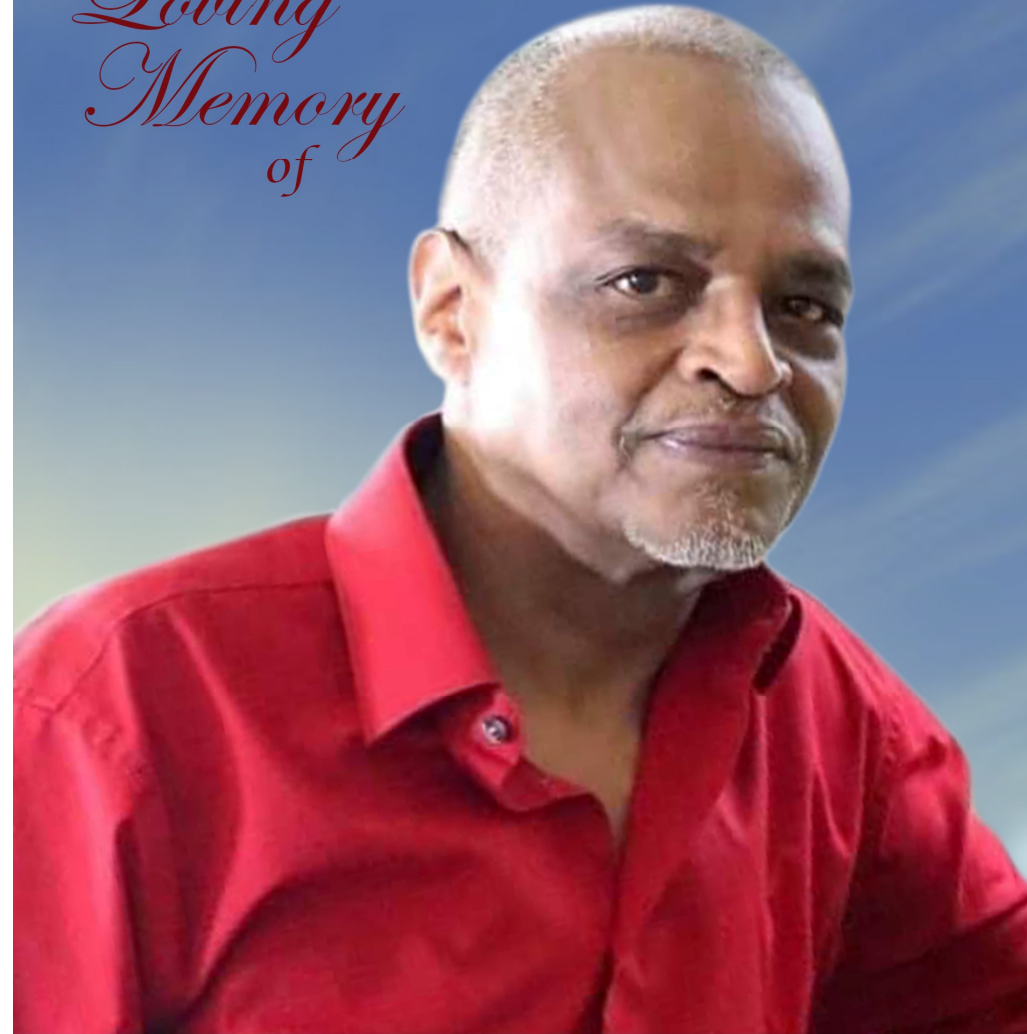
It was then that I carried you."
