

On Saturday, June 3, 2023, surrounded by family, Roland Lee Netzer, beloved husband, father, grandfather, and great-grandfather, peacefully passed away in his home at the age of 93, to be reunited in heaven with his beloved wife and other loved ones.

Roland was born December 19, 1929, to William & Ruth Netzer and raised on a South Springfield farm with two siblings, Melvin & Rowena. He married his high school sweetheart Kathryn Rose Williams on January 7, 1951. Roland earned a Bachelor's in Agriculture Education at Missouri State University and Master's in Agriculture Extension at Missouri University, graduating with honors and becoming an MU Agricultural Extension agent hosting live television shows. He was also a Korean War veteran, Lieutenant Commander in the US Navy, farm manager, poultry marketing executive, pilot, real estate agent, and self-employed organic farmer. He was the KY3 Gardener, a role in which he appeared live for television news segments helping area residents do their own best gardening, and was also the Greater Springfield Farmers Market President. He was a published author of Echoes from the Hills and even had a public television show in that regard, both of which are in libraries now.

Roland also enjoyed fishing, photography, nature study, flying aircraft, motorcycling, journaling daily for decades, traveling, and, of course, time with his loving wife and family.

Roland was caring, hardworking, intelligent, devoted, honest, patriotic, articulate in both speech and writing, resilient, and even-tempered until the very end.

One would be hard-pressed to find Roland and his wife Katy at separate events over the years; the love they found in high school stayed with-

- them all through the decades, keeping them close to one another. They were quite inseparable, even working together on the farm as the work would allow, throughout their entire adult lives, until the very end.
