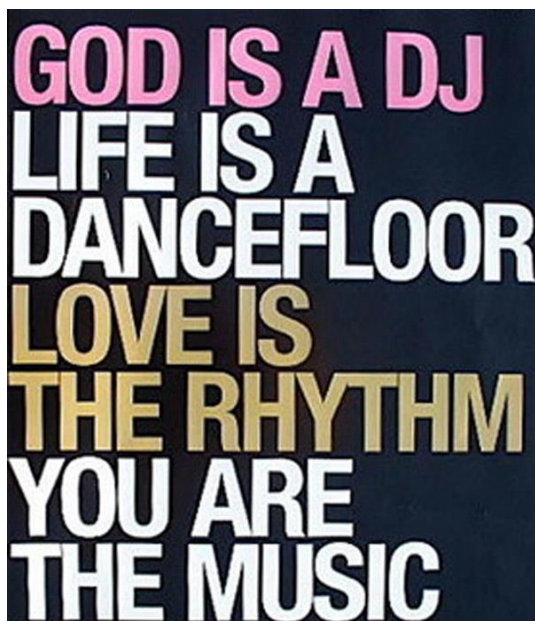

Lester was a trendsetter, coining the phrase "Trampin'", where he then created his own clothing line called "Just Tramp' N" that he used to fund his Homeless Ministry.

Lester was also known for his role as a Union President in the welding industry, serving faithfully at Hartman Electric. His commitment to his work and strong leadership skills made him highly respected among his colleagues. He was also an advocate for the homeless. Deen was truly the jack of all trades and a master of a few. He loved to laugh, joke, and entertain anyone around him, especially his family. He was truly the life of the party.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Jacqueline and Robert Jones and brothers, Roger Jones and Vincent Jones.

Lester Deen Jones leaves behind a cherished legacy.
