

## Obituary

Deacon David Lee Dennis, Sr., affectionately known as "Chief," was a devoted husband, father, grandfather, brother, uncle, neighborhood dad, business entrepreneur, mentor, hero, man of God, pillar in the community and friend. Departed his earthly vessel on February 9, 2022 at age 77. He was born to Jack and Addie Bell Dennis on December 28, 1944, in Camden, AL. David was the fourth of twelve children: seven boys and five girls all instilled with a strong faith in God and work ethic.

David accepted Christ at an early age and was baptized at St. Francis Baptist Church by Reverend Freeman. He completed his academic scholastics at Camden Academy High School where he was an anchor track star and running back on the football team. He later made the decision to join The United States Air Force in 1963. He completed his basic training in Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio, TX and was later stationed at Rickenbacker Air Force Base in Columbus, OH. David attended a dance on base and met the love of his life Cynthia E. Pratt Dennis in 1964. He reached the notable rank of Staff Sergeant while serving and completed his Air force duty in 1967.

This Southern Gentleman swept the young city girl off her feet, and they wed on May 27, 1967, in Columbus, OH at Faith Tabernacle COGIC where they attended faithfully for more than 32 years. David was ordained as a Deacon in the Lord's church and was elevated to head Deacon under the tutelage of Elder Charles H. Rogers, Sr. He was immersed in the ministry serving on the finance committee, Vacation Bible School bus driver, Captain of The Faith Tabernacle Drill Team and mentor to many young men in the ministry by employing them in his businesses. David and family later transitioned their membership to Meredith Temple COGIC under the Late Pastor Hezekiah Meredith, and then served under Pastor William A. Meredith, Sr. where he continued to serve the Lord for more than 23 years, serving on the Deacon Board and Finance committee.

David desired to see all of his children pursue additional education by attending college. All four children graduated with honors from HBCU's and pursued additional education at the graduate level.

David and Cynthia were proud owners of two pizza shops, Long Street Pizza and Main Street Pizza for more than eight years. They were the first pizza delivery service in the Columbus Metropolitan area. David was well known in the community for the delicious ribs, subs, and pizzas thus their home became the neighborhood hangout for many adults and children.



David gained his wings on February 9, 2022. He was proceeded in death by his parents Jack and Addie Bell Dennis, Brother Jerry Dennis, Sr., Sister Daisy Dennis, Sister Hettie Dennis, and Godson Robert Lane.

She called him David, honey, and another pet name I won't mention (smile)! His children call him Dad, Daddy, Daddy Dennis, and Big Dave. When we added to THE DENNIS FAMILY, he also was called Pa Pa or Paw Paw because the siblings never ended the debate on how it should be spelled. To many he was known as Dad Dennis, Dave Dennis, Big Dave (when he was Blessed with a little Dave) Chief, Mr. Dennis, Deacon & Brother Dennis. Anyway, you called him HE SHOWED UP and was our hero.

From shutting down the streets of Vendome Drive he'd train dogs in the middle of the street. People would stop and watch in awe. He had a natural gift and talent. A special way with dogs and it showed!

All of us, his children, worked in the security business in some way shape or form. We learned how to take business calls as early as kindergarten. I'd proudly answer the phone Dennis K-9 security, how may I help you? Two out of four worked in the kennels as poop scoopers, and all four of us security guards. Being raised in a house of attack trained dogs we never locked our doors!

We were the neighborhood house! Everybody knew "The Dennis's" as a result of being raised by God's best. Our front yard was well groomed with 3 round flower gardens and a flower bed that lined the house. Everything he did, he did with excellence! Homemade pizza and subs were his signature mark. We had a open door unspoken policy, anyone could come any day or time and get a plate with a cold glass of country time lemonade. He taught us the value of taking pride in everything you do. We were black pride. He'd say, "Don't cut corners. If you do it right THE FIRST TIME, you won't have to do it again!"

We hold on to every memory of God doing it again... God spared his life more times than anyone could ever count or imagine. He was the epitome of his own saying, "God can do ANYTHING but fail!"
