Of happy times we had.

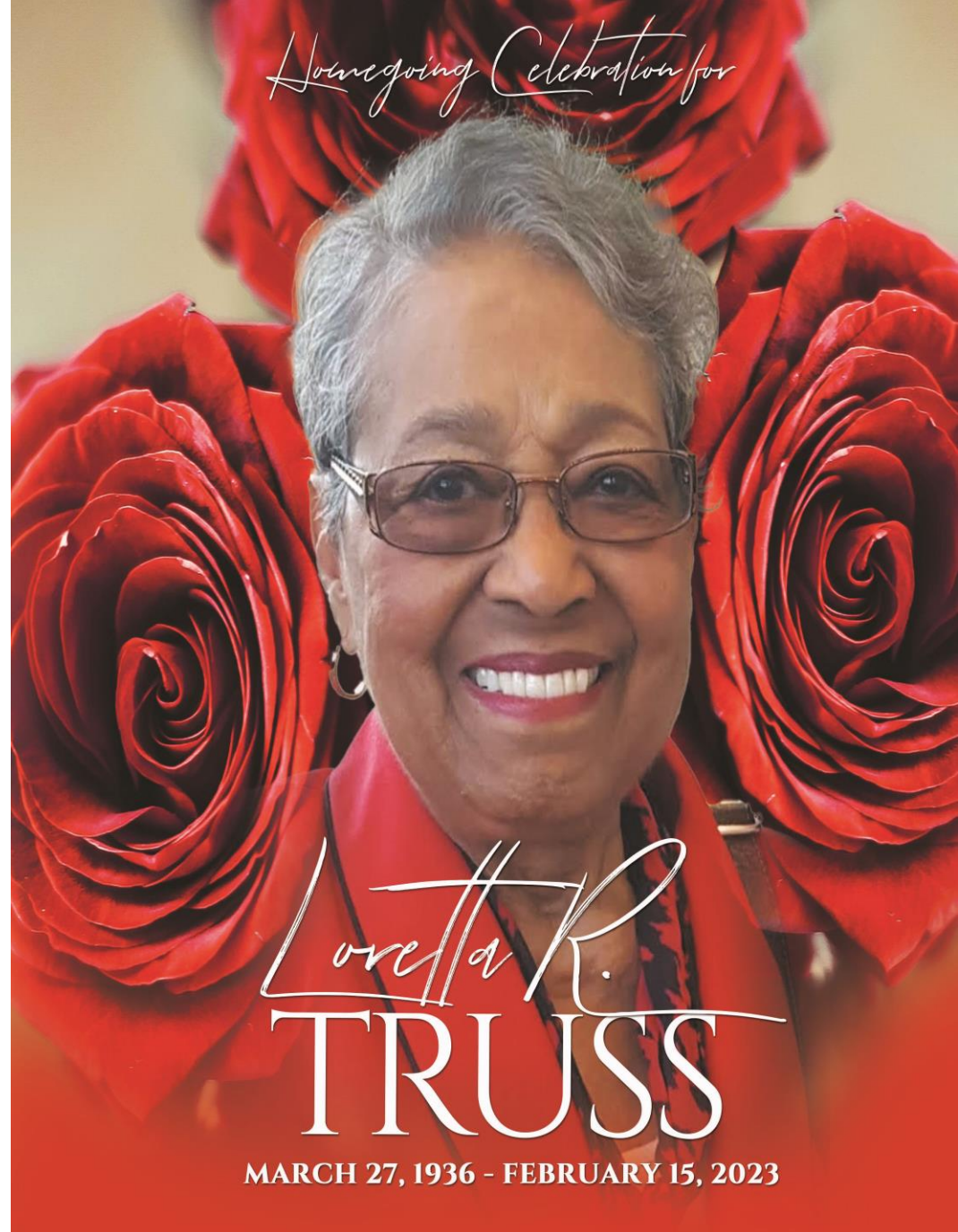
