John L. Matthews, 64, Jewell, KS passed away suddenly March 10, 2012. He was born June 9, 1947 in Manhattan to Walter L. and Genevieve L. Matthews. After living in Trinidad, CO and Paola , KS for 10 years, the family returned to Manhattan . He graduated from Manhattan High School in 1965. John began working for Southwestern Bell Telephone as a lineman in Manhattan in 1966. After working several different positions, he was promoted into management there in 1976. During his career he also worked in Topeka, Salina and Beloit , retiring in 1991. He then farmed for a number of years and worked in computer sales, as well as operating a wholesale craft business with his wife Martha.
